To ensure the effective implementation of the port security plan, the port facility should conduct regular security drills and exercises.

Security Drills

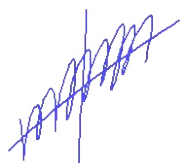
- Pursuant to article 23 of the Maritime Security Act (S.B. 2004 no. 90) and the ISPS Code, part A, paragraphs 18.3 and 18.4 as well as ISPS Code part B, paragraph 18.5, a security drill will be carried out every three months and will be reported to the designated authority within fourteen calendar days after execution.

Security Exercises

- Pursuant to article 23 of the Maritime Security Act (S.B. 2004 no. 90) and ISPS Code, part A, paragraphs 18.3 and 18.4 as well as ISPS Code part B, paragraph 18.6, a security exercise will be carried out every twelve months with no more than eighteen months between the exercises. The port facility must inform the designated authority in writing about the exercise to be carried out fourteen calendar days in advance. The report of the results of the exercise must be reported in writing to the designated authority within thirty calendar days of its execution.
