With reference to the Maritime Security Act (S.B. 2004 no. 90) and the ISPS Code, part A, paragraph 17.1, ISPS-certified port facilities must appoint a Port Facility Security Officer (PFSO) and a Deputy PFSO (DPFSO) and immediately inform the MAS accordingly.

The PFSO and DPFSO must, based on part A, paragraphs 18.1 and 18.2, and part B, paragraphs 18.1 and 18.2 of the ISPS Code, have the certificate based on the PFSO IMO Model Course 3.21 and inter alia implement the Maritime Security Instruction Drills and Exercises 2025/05 revision 1 and the Maritime Security Instruction Port Facility Security Assessment (PFSA) & Port Facility Security Plan (PFSP) 2025/04 revision 1.

Other port security personnel must, based on part A, paragraph 17.2.7 and part B, paragraph 18.2 of the ISPS Code, hold a certificate based on IMO Model Course 3.24: Security Awareness Training for Port Facility Personnel with Designated Security Duties and participate in Drills and Exercises in accordance with Maritime Security Instruction 2025/05 revision 1.

Other port personnel must, based on part A, paragraph 17.2.6 and part B, paragraph 18.3 of the ISPS Code, hold a certificate based on IMO Model Course 3.25: Security Awareness Training for all Port Facility Personnel and participate in Drills and Exercises in accordance with Maritime Security Instruction 2025/05 revision 1.
