With reference to Article 9 of the Maritime Security Act (S.B 2004 no. 90) and Articles 2.4.12.2, 2.8.17 and 3.10.3 of the Guide to Maritime Security and the ISPS Code, every port facility must have a Local Port Security Committee (LPSC) for structured consultation with stakeholders regarding maritime security. The LPSC consists of, inter alia, representatives of port workers, the Suriname Customs, the Suriname Fire Brigade, the National Army, the Suriname Police Corps and the Immigration Service.

Multiple port facilities located in 1 (one) district can constitute 1 (one) or more LPSC, subject to approval by the designated authority.

The LPSC must meet at least once a year. The report of the meeting must be sent to the designated authority within 30 (thirty) calendar days. The designated authority may attend meetings of the LPSC.
